




#### Systems Approaches

### SPECIES AWARENESS--C

How do we keep our ignorance from destroying us?

WHEN WE APPRECIATE OUR PRIMATE NATURE, WE CAN LEARN TO PROTECT OUR EARTH AND OURSELVES FROM OUR POOR JUDGMENT.

WE CAN COME TO UNDERSTAND THAT IDEOLOGIES AND THEOLOGIES ARE ADDICTIVE AND ULTIMATELY DESTRUCTIVE DEVICES THAT IT IS IN HUMAN NATURE TO CREATE, DEVELOP AND FIGHT OVER LIKE WARRING TRIBES OF CHIMPANZEES.



The answer is self-awareness, wisdom and the cultivation of balanced human values:

- Allowing time for reflection and self-care;Responsibility without perfection;
  - Love without obedience,
  - Being works-in-progress our entire lives, always seeking and giving balance, compassion and forgiveness.




